



## Pelton Community Primary School Sports Premium 2020-2021



In 2020/2021 Pelton Community Primary School received **£18470.00** in Sport Premium, with **£4709** carried forward from last year's budget which was unspent due the closure of schools during the COVID 19 pandemic giving a total of **£23,179.00**. This document details how this will be allocated. Achieved objectives are highlighted along with the impact/sustainability and specific achievements detailed in **blue**. More information is in **bold**. Objectives not achieved or money not spent due to Government restrictions or school closure highlighted in **Yellow**.

The Sport Premium funding has been provided by the government to ensure impact against the following objective:

*To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.*

It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision (above) that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.
